

Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. Do I have to raise an animal? –No, FFA has many other opportunities other than raising animals . Such as, LDEs, CDEs and SDEs (see front for more information)
- 2. Do I have to be in an ag class to be an FFA member? Yes, FFA Members must be in an ag class.
- 3. Do I have to pay my FFA dues if I am in an ag class? —Dues are only required of you want to be an FFA member, not everyone in an ag class is required to pay dues.
- 4. Do I have to keep my animal at my house? No, Tomball ISD Project Show animals may be kept at the school farm (across the street from TMHS.)
- 5. What if I cannot afford an animal? The Folkerts family offers a scholarship for animal raisers if they need assistance.
- 6. What Animals can I raise? —At the Tomball ISD Project Show FFA members can exhibit Rabbits, Broilers, Turkeys, Steers, Lambs, Goats and Pigs. Turkeys and steers must be purchased in March.
- 7. How much do animals projects cost? The purchase price of the animal ranges Below is an approximate price list: Payment has already been collected for the 2021 TISD Show
 - Broilers- \$75.00 for pen of 25
 - Goats-\$415.00
 - Steers-\$1,880.00
 - Pigs-\$360.00

- Sheep-\$415.00
- Rabbits-\$225.00 for pen of 4
- Turkeys- \$125.00
- Prices above do not include rent, supplies, feed or any other cost associated with raising an animal

Agriculture Classes

<u>Principles of Agriculture</u> – Introduces students to agriculture by learning the historical, current and future significance of agriculture and the FFA.

Equine Science – Analyze the selection, nutrition, reproduction, health, and management of horses.

<u>Wildlife</u> – Examine the importance of wildlife and natural resources, including the management of different species of wildlife. Hunter Safety Certification.

<u>Horticulture</u> – Students will learn employable characteristics, skills in dealing with plants, the ability to control common pests, and marketing and management skills.

<u>Floral Design</u> – Examines floral design and its relation to contemporary designs, business practices, specialty items, creativity, and careers in the floral industry. – **Art Credit**

<u>Ag Mechanic/Welding</u> –These courses develops skills in tool identification and safe use, metal working, and welding processes.

<u>Advanced Animal Science</u> – This technical course continues the development of knowledge and skills pertaining to the nutrition, reproduction, health, and management of domestic animals. – <u>4th year Science Credit</u> <u>Small Animal Management</u> – Will allow further knowledge into those none-livestock species, and give basic knowledge of companion animals needed to pursue a path of veterinary medicine.

<u>Veterinary Medical Applications</u> – Introductory course giving students knowledge and skills of veterinary sciences needed to pursue a path of veterinary medicine.

<u>Veterinary Medical Practicum</u> – Paid or unpaid capstone experience for students participating in veterinary career cluster. Student will work hands on with a veterinarian in the community.
